# Message - "Mary's Message of Liberation"

The Angel Gabriel asked Mary to become the mother of the Son of God Luke 1: 35. He said to her "The Holy Spirit will come upon you and the power of the Most High will overshadow you: so, the child to be born of you will be called Holy, the Son of God".

## **Hearing Afresh Mary's Message:**

Normally when we read or listen to Mary's *Magnificat*, we're tempted to <u>soften its</u> <u>message and spiritualize its meaning</u>. But I'd like for us to read Mary's song afresh to re-discover what Mary meant by her own words.

And Mary said:

"My soul magnifies the Lord,

And my spirit rejoices in God my Saviour,

for he has remembered me, his lowly servant!

His name is holy; from one generation to another,

He shows mercy to those who honour him,

He has performed mighty deeds with his arm;

He has <u>scattered those who are proud in their inmost thoughts</u>.

He has brought down rulers from their thrones

but has lifted up the humble.

He has filled the hungry with good things

but has sent the rich away empty."

#### Three important Questions, we need to find answers to.

- What sorts of things did Mary expect God to do through Her son?. In other words, what did Mary expect the long-awaited Messiah to be like?
- What did she see as the Messiah's mission on earth? Lk 4:16ff
- What sorts of things did Mary anticipate He would accomplish?

#### She had a dream and a vision for her son and for her people

- She announces the promises of God to her people.
- She proclaims the liberative message of salvation promised by God <u>to her</u> people.
- She speaks of the deeds being realised by God. She mentions the type of impact God has on <u>her people</u>.

# The Deep Significance of the Birth of Jesus Christ or Christmas to Mary and Joseph

"The arrogant of heart and mind He has brought down from their thrones. But the humble have been lifted high. The hungry He has satisfied with good things, the rich sent empty away."

## It means;

Political and economic revolution.

Breaking the monopoly of the rich.

Feeding the hungry with good things.

But the church and the Christian tradition has successfully domesticated Mary to known as the **comforter of the disturbed**, not as a disturber of the comfortable. Latin American theologians especially liberation theology sees Mary on the side of the **needy**, the **weak** and the **exploited**.

This is whole mark of the Church or Christianity...a few years back Pope Francis visited Myanmar- the Church had urged the Pope not to talk about Rohingya people and even not to say that word Rohingya....essentially taboo...That means friendship/diplomacy is important than truth and Justice.

This passage – Lk 4:16ff...

- It is the longest set of words spoken by a woman in the New Testament.
- It is also the first Christmas carol ever composed.

#### Character and the journey of Mary

Soon after her famous first carol of the world, the Romans required Mary to walk 90 miles while pregnant with a baby to the small rural town of Bethlehem. She was a perfect mother- physically/spiritually strong woman with good <u>powers of endurance</u> and <u>tolerance</u>, rather than a type of gentle Madonna that we see in the **paintings of Raphael**, **Filippo Lippi**, **or Leonardo da Vinci**.

- She travelled with Joseph from Nazareth in Galilee to Bethlehem in Judea, a distance of about 90 miles.
- She was a tough ordinary woman of the people. She was rejected by the well-to-do house holders of the day.
- Joseph and Mary had no choice but a cattle shed to use to give birth to Jesus Christ...she had to be with the animals. Homeless...
- We can compare Mary and Joseph with: the trials and hardships which many people in the **slums** of modem cities have to suffer every day, Homeless people, Millions of **refugees** all over the world, **Rohingya** community over 700,000, What is happening in Palestine right now? How many million refugees? Over 45,000 people were killed over 100,000 wounded, there's no end.
- As to being a Migrant worker, Mary along with Joseph would have experienced tribulations of by being foreign workers in Egypt. She experienced the problems which many of the migrants are facing in the rich countries. Called names...told to go back to your country...etc.
- Joseph and Mary experienced the **hatred**, the **jealousy** and the **venom** of the political rulers of the day. They felt the savage brutality of the soldiers of Herod. It was not a silent night..

Mary of Nazareth, while completely devoted to the **will of God**, was far from being a fearful submissive woman. She was a woman who did not hesitate to proclaim that God is on the <u>side of the poor</u>, <u>the humble and the oppressed</u>, and <u>God will remove</u> the privileges and positions from the powerful (Lk. 1:51-53).

These are the perfect qualities of the disciple of the Lord, faithfully she followed the <u>will of God</u> and always she was with Jesus, when Jesus was born, she must have said to herself, 'this is my blood and my flesh' and at the cross, when they removed the body of Christ from Cross to her lap, she must have repeated the same words 'this is my blood and my flesh'. That's the words we use to take part in the holy communion.
