#### **Lighting the Advent Candles**

The Gospel of John speaks of Christ as the true light coming into the world. In commemoration of that coming, we light candles for the four weeks leading to Christmas and reflect on the coming of Christ. It is significant that the church has always used that language—the coming of Christ—because it speaks to a deep truth. Christ is coming. Christ is always coming, always entering a troubled world, a wounded heart. And so we light the first candle, the candle of hope, and dare to express our longing for peace, for healing, and the well-being of all creation.

First candle is lit.

While seated we sing one verse of <u>"O Come, O come Emmanuel"</u> (HFTC 66)

Loving God, as we enter this Advent season,

We open all the dark places in our lives and memories to the healing light of Christ.

Show us the creative power of hope.
Prepare our hearts to be transformed by you,
That we may walk in the light of Christ.
Amen

# Hymn AA 9: Carol our Christmas (Shirley Murray)

# Hymn: Prepare the Way With Quietness (Protest of Praise; Tune: Land of Rest)

- Prepare the way with quietness, a stillness in the storm, that will not speak the wounding words that cheapen or deform.
- 2. Prepare the way with hopeful words some mock but others crave, that makes the empire flinch in fear and turn the fearful brave.
- Prepare the way through holding back while others grasp and strain

- for unjust wealth and untamed power that add to human pain.
- 4. Prepare the way with fervent love that tears down walls of hate and reconstructs a kinder world that justice can create.
- 5. Prepare the way until we reach the dawn of that new day when all our paths converge in Christ, and we have found our way.
